Sending Our Message to Kids—Future Life Safety Leaders!

The Tamagawa Fire Station carried out a fire drill on Friday, January 26, 2018 at the Kuhonbutsu Joshinji Temple (7-41-3, Okusawa, Setagaya-ku) as a Cultural Property Fire Prevention Day event.

The temple has nine Amida tathagata statues—the tangible cultural properties designated by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government. Emergency responders joined in this exercise, and enhanced their skills; they were from the Tamagawa Volunteer Fire Corps, the Kuhonbutsu Joshinji private fire brigade, the ward firefighting unit of the Kuhonbutsu neighborhood association, the Tokyo Fire Department volunteer group, and the Tamagawa Fire Station as well.

The event was climaxed by simultaneous water shooting with the Joshinji head priest commanding the water discharge. This finale gave a great surprise to a lot of nursery school pupils, *prospective future life safety leaders,* stressing the value of cultural properties.
